Searching for Records:

Search Tab:

- Books Access digital online books (key word search results for Germany was over 56,700 entries), some books may only be accessible online through a computer at your local FHC, some you may be able to access from your home
- Records Access to online historical records collections for free, some records may be indexed with images, and some may not have
 indexes, but have images that can be browsed, and some collections are only indexes without images
- Browse All Published Collections allows users to see all published collections by place and filter out collections as desired
- Main Records Page includes a search engine with filters where users can search by life event, relationships, residence, and users can restrict record searches

 Genealogies-search user contributed databases of pedigree charts (Tip - look for the submission ID to view the users entire submission.)

<u>Ancestral File</u>: A static collection of genealogies submitted by users prior to 2003 (40 million). Submissions were merged to eliminate duplication. Contains – 100,000 pre – 1600s names (= 25,000 families).

<u>Pedigree Resource File</u>: A growing collection of genealogies submitted by users (100s of millions). No corrections or merges are made.

<u>IGI</u>: Information from over 430 million ancestors contributed by members of the LDS Church – each record contains one event: birth, baptism (christening), marriage, or death.

<u>Community Trees</u>: A collection of sourced genealogies from specific times and places have been linked according to family lineages and relations.

- Family History Centres-over 4,700 worldwide, offering personal assistance to family history researchers. Gain access to premium family history subscription websites for free, access the microform collection at the Granite Mountain Record Vault through online ordering, and access local collections which vary from centre to centre.
